
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to Help You Navigate the AI Era







1. Practice writing good prompts for AI. How well and detailed you can write a prompt will make a big difference in the quality of information you get back.






2. Make sure you utilize your intellectual curiosity. In other words, make sure you're willing and able to dig deeper than the surface to learn new things. Just because AI says it, doesn't make it factual. Dig deeper to be certain.





3. Be adaptable. If you're not getting what you're looking for, you have to be able to adapt and change your wording. Ask your question in a different way, do more research, or whatever else may be required when it comes to working with AI.





4. Use critical thinking skills and be objective. All is only as smart, and as bias, as those who program it, and it doesn't have a clue about copyrights at this point.





5. Be sure to tap into your empathy when using Al. While Al tools can assess and respond, only humans can analyze that response and make sure that it's not only true, but that it's not offensive. As a human, you have the obligation to figure out the best way to communicate the response from Al to others rather than just copying it word for word every time.





6. Be creative and original. Just like the previous tip suggests, you should NEVER copy the AI response word for word. Add your own spin on it. Be creative. Make sure it represents your voice, your tone, and your originality.





7. Ask AI to act as a certain persona for a better description. For example, you can ask AI to answer as a college professor with 20 years experience, or a veterinarian who specializes in wild animal rehab. You get the idea.





8. Ask for output at a specific reading level, especially if you're trying to explain something with a lot of complex jargon. This will help make it so that people can more easily comprehend what it is you're explaining or describing.
